# **BREAD OF LIFE FEEDING MINISTRY UPDATE**

Thanks to all who have worked in the food pantry so far during December. We served 115 families at the Covington pantry the first Saturday; 85 families were served in the pouring rain at the Brighton pantry second Saturday; and 90 families were served in Covington last Saturday. Since the fourth Saturday falls on Christmas, the Brighton Pantry will be open from 6-8 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 23. To all who have donated plastic grocery bags and canned fruit, many thanks. We once again received an additional 24 bushels of beautiful sweet potatoes from Denard Clemons, a truck patch farmer from Drummonds.

Atoka Elementary School conducted a food drive over the past two weeks to benefit nine families they were assisting and they collected so much food, they gifted us with several hundred pounds of canned and dry food items. Thanks to Debbie Neal, Laura Thornton and Brittany Mize for making that connection for us and for transporting the food to the church.

The staff and students of Covington Integrated Arts Academy once again came through for us with 100 cans of fruit which was distributed at our Brighton food pantry last Saturday. Thanks to them! In addition, we have received over 300 pounds of ground deer meat from Farmers and Ranchers for the Hungry thanks to Joey Caldwell and Todd Rankin. That meat is much appreciated.
