

Adults may choose from five different study options:



#### July 30 through August 5, 2011:

- 2 households received \$50 in food items (paid to the vendor).
- 1 household received 2 nights lodging (totaling \$64.00 and paid to the vendor).
- 1 household received \$20 worth of baby items (paid to the vendor).
- 2 household received assistance with rent totaling \$309 (paid to the vendors).
- 7 households received utility assistance totaling \$336.76 (paid to the vendor).
- 1 household received a bed mattress while another household received an electric skillet. Both items had been donated earlier by membership.

#### Grand Totals January 1, 2011 through today's date:

- 3 individuals received \$344.82 for bus ticket to return home (paid directly to the vendor)
- 19 individual received \$375 total in groceries (paid directly to the vendor).
- 24 households received lodging (totaling \$1,489.99 and paid to the vendor).
- 11 households received \$560.00 in miscellaneous items (paid to the vendor).
- 2 households received \$59.39 in assistance with prescriptions (paid to the vendor).
- 21 household received \$2,142.70 in rent assistance (paid directly to the vendor).
- 114 households received assistance with utilities totaling \$9,262.77 (paid to the vendor)
- 29 households received a total of \$685 in vehicular gas (paid directly to the vendor).




#### Stories of interest:

- A woman called today requesting help to secure a propane tank to cook with. Initially, I thought her request was for propane heating but found out that she has been using a grill and propane tank for cooking because she does not have a stove. She said she had not had money to purchase propane and had not been able to heat food items since sometime in July. She had heard about FUMC helping families in need. I asked if she would she prefer an electric skillet and I wished you could have seen her eyes light up. She said "Oh yes that would be so much cheaper than propane!". Would you believe the electric skillet was dropped by the church office <u>earlier that morning!</u>
- A young mother came to the church requesting assistance with her utility bill of \$104.59. Her husband had been detained in Louisiana as an illegal alien and deported back to his homeland which I believe is Mexico. She indicated he was detained for 7 months and just was deported recently. The couple have two boys ages 4 and 3 who are adorable and very well behaved while in the church office. The young lady appears in shock and numb. I assured her that I would share parts of her story with the membership for your prayer considerations.




